Oak Forest Park District, a municipal governing agency, provides parks, recreational facilities and activities for its residents. The Board of Commissioners is made up of 5 elected officials, each serving six-year terms. Board meetings are held the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month at 7:00pm at the Central Park Building, 15601 S. Central Avenue and are open to the public.

To Our Residents:

With Winter almost behind us we look forward to warmer weather and longer days to enjoy all that Summer has to offer!

A long time project of replacing the flooring at both the Central Park Community Center and the Don Gorman Recreation Center has finally come to fruition! At the Central Park Community Center; our lobby, Oak Room, Conference Room and entire lower level now sport the warmth of luxury vinyl tile in wood tone. Along with these areas we replaced the stair treads (no more blue stairs!) and placed walk off carpet tiles in the vestibule and back hallways. The Don Gorman Recreation Center sports the same luxury vinyl tile throughout the building, giving this facility the long overdue update it needed; providing a much warmer appeal when you walk in.

As I mentioned in the last letter, we have a new greenhouse. Our maintenance crew definitely worked hard in building this new greenhouse at Gingerwood just in time to remove the outdoor plants from the ground, and into the new larger greenhouse before the weather changed. Many new clippings from those existing plants and flowers are already taking shape to be planted in our many surrounding parks.

As with any building; maintaining the structure is quite important. We have and will continue on with masonry work at the Central Park Community Center to keep the building in it's good shape.

As Summer is right around the corner; keep us in mind for your next picnic space! We have picnic shelters available for rent at Central Park, El Morro Park and Gingerwood Park. Information can be found on page 8 of this brochure. We also have indoor rental spaces that can accommodate from 60 to 120 people. With the new flooring the Conference Room, which will now be called the Maple Room, will be host to a perfect space for a meeting or small event of 40 or less attendees. Information on all our indoor rental spaces can be found on pages 4, 5, 6 and 7.

This will be my last letter I write to the residents; as I have made the decision to retire this Spring. I am not sure where all the years went, but they sure did move by quickly. It has been a pleasure to work for the Oak Forest Park District and to be a part of serving the residents of Oak Forest. 

REGISTRATION POLICIES

GISTRATION INI

- Registration can be completed in person at our Administrative Offices M-F 9:00am-5:00pm, or online. All new households must come in to set-up a household account for online registration.
- Proof of residency must be provided with registration. Any questions of boundaries will be decided by the Park District and this decision will be final.
- Resident rates will apply to those residing within Oak Forest Park District residency boundaries. Additional fees may apply to those outside of Oak Forest Park District residency boundaries.
- Activity registration is on a first come first serve basis
- Incomplete registration forms may delay your registration. This includes correct activity numbers and waiver signatures.
- Phone numbers and emails are required when registering. We will use the provided number/email to contact you about activity changes, and in case of emergencies.

• Fees will not be prorated on late registration.

- Registrants will be responsible for remembering dates and times of their activities. Assume activities are running unless you hear otherwise from Park District personnel.
- The building is open for drop box registration M-F 7:00am-8:00pm and Sat. 8:00am-1:00pm. The Park District is not responsible for cash put in drop-box.
- Mail-in registration will be accepted by check payable to Oak Forest Park District. The Park District is not responsible for lost or late mail.
- Payment plans may be available for select activities. This must be approved by activity supervisor. Payment plans must be paid by credit/debit cards.
- Activity information is subject to change depending on unforeseen circumstances.

PARK DISTRICT CANCELLATION POLICY:

All activities have a min/max enrollment. If the minimum enrollment has not been reached, the Recreation Department reserves the right to cancel, postpone or consolidate the activity with another. You will be notified if an alternative choice is available. If an activity is cancelled, a full refund will be issued without penalty.

NON-SUFFICIENT FUND POLICY

For all returned checks for Non-Sufficient Funds (NSF), or declined credit/debit cards, a \$35.00 fee will be assessed. In order to continue enrollment in park activities, the returned check/declined card payment must be paid for with cash within 10 days.

PHOTO USE

Oak Forest Park District reserves the right to photograph or videotape participants in its activities and/or at its facilities. These photos/videos are for Oak Forest Park District use and may be used in Oak Forest Park District publications, flyers, brochures, videos, advertisements, newspapers, and on Oak Forest Park District social media outlets.

REFUND POLICY

- A full refund will be issued without penalty for any program, special event or trip canceled by Oak Forest Park District. If the refund amount is less than \$10.00, the amount will be applied as a household credit. No refunds will be issued for special events, one-day programs, trips or a class with a fee of \$10.00 or less if the participant chooses to cancel.
- A \$10.00 administrative charge will be assessed to all activities (\$200.00 for Fun Time Activity, see page 13).
- Refunds are issued as follows:
- 100% **before** the start of 1st class
- 75% before the start of 2nd class
- 50% **before** the start of 3rd class
- No refunds after 3 classes attended or unattended. The only exception is a medical reason, requiring a doctor's note or relocation out of the area. These refunds may not apply to contractual activities*
- Contractual activity refunds: Contractual activities are offered by a variety of different companies and refunds vary from contractor to contractor. Please contact the park district recreation supervisor directly regarding refunds for these classes.
- Activities which include tickets for entertainment/ sporting events, adult sports leagues, and trips require that vacancy to be filled by another participant in order for a refund to be given.
- All refunds must be applied for in person at the Central Park Building, 15601 S. Central Ave.
- Please allow up to 8 weeks for processing.
- All refunds are subject to supervisor approval.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Participants are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior at all times. The following guidelines have been developed to help make Park District activities safe and enjoyable for all participants. Additional rules may be developed for particular activities and athletic leagues as deemed necessary by staff.

Participants shall:

- 1. Show respect to all participants and staff, as well as take direction from staff
- 2. Refrain from using abusive or foul language.
- **3.** Refrain from causing bodily harm to self, or other participants or staff.
- 4. Show respect to equipment, supplies and facilities. No vandalism to anything will be tolerated.
- 5. Do not bring food, gum or beverage into gymnasium.
- **6.** No hindering of employees.
- 7. No resisting or interfering with an officer.

DISCIPLINE:

A positive approach will be used regarding discipline. Staff will periodically review rules with participants during the session. If inappropriate behavior occurs, prompt resolution will be sought, specific to each individual situation. The Park District reserves the right to dismiss a participant whose behavior endangers the safety of themselves or others.

OAK FOREST POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Oak Forest Police Department does a great job of keeping an eye on your parks. We can use your help as well. If you see vandalism occurring or any other criminal activity, please help us by reporting what you see. THREATS OF VIOLENCE


The Oak Forest Park District is committed to the safety and well-being of staff and patrons. All acts of threats or violence by activity participants will be taken seriously and the Oak Forest Park District will promptly respond to any incident or suggestion of violence. Violation of this policy will result in disciplinary action, up to and including suspension or denial of participation, at the discretion of the Oak Forest Park District.

ARSON TIPSTER AWARD ACTIVITY -STOP SENSELESS DAMAGE

In an effort to reduce and eliminate senseless damage caused by arson, the Oak Forest Park District encourages you to report any information you have about individuals causing fire damage to District property.

Reward: If the information you provide leads to the arrest of the arson perpetrator or conspirator, you may be eligible for a reward of up to \$500.00.

Confidential Communication: All communications between the Arson Tipster and the Oak Forest Park District are strictly confidential. The Oak Forest Park District will not release or disclose any information furnished by the Arson Tipster without the Tipster's explicitly consent and approval. 



CODE OF CONDUCT

Youth Sports are designed and organized to enhance the physical, emotional, social and educational well-being of children. As role models, parents must make a serious effort to take an active role in the youth sports experience of their child providing positive support as a spectator, coach, league official or board member. Demonstrating sportsmanlike behavior as a parent, a fan or a coach will teach our children how to demonstrate good sportsmanship toward others in their play. The Oak Forest Park District has a Code of Conduct for Players, Parents/ Spectators and Coaches, outlining positive behavior and encouraging good sportsmanship. Copies of these are available at the park district upon request or to view online. In addition, the background of volunteers has become a national concern. To address this concern, the Oak Forest Park District has researched and created a volunteer coach background check procedure. The Board of Commissioners has a policy for all youth sport organizations desiring the use of Oak Forest Park District athletic fields and facilities. This policy requires that all coaches consent to a background check.

YOUTH ATHLETICS

REFUND POLICY

The refund policy below is specific to Basketball, Flag Cheerleading, Flag Football, Girl's Softball, Lacrosse, Soccer and Wrestling. Refunds for these programs will abide by the following guidelines:

- Refunds turned in prior to one month of the program start date to the Central Park Building will be issued in their entirety

OAK FOREST PARK DISTRICT FLAG FOOTBALL AND CHEERLEADING

The Oak Forest Park District Flag Football & Cheerleading Program (OFPDFF) is like no other program around. We are a full contact, non-tackle league that teaches the fundamentals of football while supporting that each participant plays hard and has fun! The league is comprised of youths aged 7-14, (Must be 7 years old before Sept. 1) but not yet in high school. For over 50 years, OFPDFF has been providing quality instruction in football and cheerleading. Our season starts in early August with practices and drill work. Our season kicks off with "Exhibition Sunday" including our Family Fun Fest, Punt, Pass and Kick Competition and exhibition games. Regular season games are played on Sundays at various parks in Oak Forest. Our season concludes in November with a banquet. Football Teams: There are two divisions:

Junior (ages 7-10) and Senior (ages 11-14). Each team is composed of between 12-15 players (depending on registration size) with an adult led coaching crew. OFPDFF plays with a standard 11-player set with full contact blocking. Each player learns the fundamentals of football including offense (blocking schemes, pass route running, and running plays); defense (defensive front and cover skills); and special teams (punting and kicking).






